

Speech of the National Tempus Office Director

Your Excellencies, Honorable Guests, Ladies and Gentlemen,

**It is a great pleasure to have you with us today, and we would like to
thank you for taking the time to participate in the fourth national Tempus
day.**

**Tempus is the European Union programme that supports the
modernization of higher education in the partner countries. It
contributes to creating an area of cooperation in the field of higher
education between the European Union and partner countries.**

**Over the past five years, the National Tempus Office has promoted the
Tempus program and encouraged Jordanian institutions to benefit from
this program. This was accomplished through number of activities.
These included conducting four main conferences, such as this one,
holding about 20 seminars/presentations at Jordanian universities,
meeting more than 100 small teams of faculty members and individuals
at the NTO, publishing and disseminating about 10 quality brochures
and booklets like the one you have in your folder today, and arranging
press and media coverage for main activities and events.**

So, this is what was done ... What was the result?

The answer is: Outstanding!

Tempus III that took place in the period 2002-2007 funded a total of 23 projects and 26 individual mobility grants, which involved the participation of Jordanian institutions. Out of these projects, those that are national (only Jordan from MEDA countries is involved as the beneficiary) had a total budget of over 4 Million Euros, while multi-county projects had a budget of over 3.7 Million Euros. In these projects, 12 Jordanian institutions have participated, which included most of the public and some private universities, in addition to about 10 other organizations and NGOs. Also, cooperation with 14 European countries and seven Mediterranean countries took place through these projects. Exchanges of hundreds of academic staff and students between Jordan / MEDA and Europe took place over the past period. We were happy to coordinate, facilitate and monitor the execution of these projects over the past years. Providing counseling, advice and assistance to faculty members on number of issues they faced during project implementation ensured the conformance with the EC guidelines and maximum benefit to the participating institutions and to Jordan.

We are today proud to say that due to above dedicated efforts of the NTO, the Tempus program in Jordan has been quite visible, well-respected and admired by the academic community, and extremely competitive. Success rate (ratio of projects that were selected compared to those submitted) was between 10-15%. This enabled Tempus to fund only the very best projects that are in line with the Jordanian strategy of higher education and where the need is greatest. Also, due to close monitoring and assistance provided to projects and institutions, impact and benefits of the Tempus funds were maximized. The competitive nature of Tempus projects has indeed helped beneficiary institutions in Jordan to enhance the quality and relevance of their higher education programs and align themselves with world class European universities.

Today, we are here to present to you the second call of Tempus IV and the launch of Erasmus Mundus II program. Because these programs were carefully designed based upon lessons learnt from the previous phases, they include several enhancements as compared with their

predecessors and number of new elements to partner countries. All this will be explained today by Ms. Alba-Chiara Tiberi, who came from the European Commission in Brussels especially for meeting you and talking to you. In addition to Tempus and Erasmus-Mundus that are devoted mostly to teaching, the European Commission has a large Framework Program for cooperation in research, I am sure several of you know, which is called FP 7. The latest in this program will be presented to you by Ms. Germana Topolovec, from the EC Delegation in Amman.

The European Union has paid good attention to the reform and development of its higher education system and established what is known as “European Higher Education Area”. We shed some light today at the Euro-Jordanian perspectives by looking at two important subjects: learning outcomes as an effective tool for quality assurance and Mobility and academia across cultures, which will be presented respectively by Prof. Ziad Al-Sa'ad, Vice-President of German-Jordanian University and Prof. Ahmed Majdoubeh, Dean, Faculty of Arts, University of Jordan. Both Professors are among the higher education reform experts, trying to benefit from European experiences towards the reform of the Jordanian higher education system.

We hope that today’s presentations will provide you with the appropriate knowledge and equip you with the necessary tools and resources to enable you to benefit from these programs. The Tempus day also gives you the chance to network and talk about possible consortia that may work together. Because funds are quite limited, we strongly encourage Jordanian universities to collaborate together in Tempus projects.

For us, at the National Tempus Office, we aim at making the Tempus projects involving Jordan more and more competitive. This will enhance the quality, and will in turn contribute to the on-going process of the higher education reform in Jordan. We look forward to strengthening further the collaboration between Jordanian higher education institutions and their European counterparts, through the Tempus, Erasmus Mundus and other programs in higher education and research.
