

**Speech of the National Tempus Office Director

Honorable Guests, Ladies and Gentlemen,

We are indeed very delighted to welcome you today. We would like to thank all of you for taking the time to participate in our sixth Tempus conference addressing cooperation in higher education and research between Jordan and Europe.

Over the past seven years, the National Tempus Office has been promoting the Tempus program and encouraging Jordanian institutions to benefit from this program.

Tempus III that took place in the period 2002-2007 funded a total of 23 projects and 26 individual mobility grants, which involved the participation of Jordanian institutions. Then Tempus IV that started in 2007 funded 11 more projects. Through these projects more than 12 million Euros were spent to strengthen the relations between Jordan and Europe in higher education. In these projects, 14 Jordanian institutions have participated, which included most of the public and several private universities, in addition to about 10 other organizations and NGOs. Also, cooperation with 16 European countries and seven Mediterranean countries took place through these projects. Exchanges of hundreds of academic staff and students between Jordan / MEDA and Europe took place over the past period. We were happy to coordinate, facilitate and monitor the execution of these projects over the past

years. Providing counseling, advice and assistance to faculty members on number of issues they faced during project implementation ensured the conformance with the EC guidelines and maximum benefit to the participating institutions and to Jordan.

We are proud today to say that the Tempus program in Jordan has been very-well known, quite visible, well-respected and highly admired by the academic community. Through Tempus, the European higher education system and institutions are now better known to Jordanian academicians and students, and more Europeans know the higher education in Jordan and have better understanding of the Jordanian culture and people.

Tempus is becoming extremely competitive. Faculty members compete hard to participate in Tempus projects. Success rate (ratio of projects that are selected compared to those submitted) is between 10-15%. This enabled Tempus to fund only the very best projects that are in line with the Jordanian strategy of higher education and where the need is greatest. Also, due to close monitoring and assistance provided to projects and institutions, impact and benefits of the Tempus funds were maximized. The competitive nature of Tempus projects has indeed helped beneficiary institutions in Jordan to enhance the quality and relevance of their higher education programs and align themselves with world class European universities.

Today, we are here to present to you the new calls of Tempus IV and Erasmus Mundus II programs, together with some hints on how to develop successful proposals. Because these programs were carefully designed based upon lessons learnt from the previous phases, they include several enhancements as compared with their predecessors and number of new elements to partner countries. All this will be explained today by my colleagues Mr. Abel Piqueras from the EC Delegation in Amman, Dr. Rami Ayoubi, Director of the Tempus Office in Syria, and myself. Sharing experience gained through Tempus program is important, and it would be our pleasure to hear about the butterfly effect from Dr. Rana Dajani at Hashemite University.

The European Union has paid good attention to research and made generous allocations to fund research projects both within Europe and in partner countries. Ms. Raghda Kilani from the Higher Council of Science & Technology will brief us about the latest in FP7.

We hope that today's presentations will provide you with the appropriate knowledge and equip you with the necessary tools and resources to enable you to benefit from these programs. The Tempus conference also gives you the chance to network and talk about possible consortia that may work together. Because funds are quite limited, we strongly encourage Jordanian universities to collaborate together in Tempus projects.

For us, at the National Tempus Office, we aim at making the Tempus projects involving Jordan more and more competitive. This will enhance the quality, and will in turn contribute to the on-going process of the higher education reform in Jordan. We look forward to strengthening further the collaboration between Jordanian higher education institutions and their European counterparts, through the Tempus, Erasmus Mundus and other programs in higher education and research.
